

STATUE OF LIBERTY CUBE

DIRECTIONS: 1. If paper is white, color it first; 2. Cut out all pieces on outer dark lines; 3. For body, fold all dotted lines downward. Glue or tape side tabs behind pieces beside it (Figure 1); 4. For tablet, hand-fold on dotted line at elbow downward, put a drop of glue over words, or tape, and match up the two pieces (Figure 2); 5. For torch, hand-fold at dotted line downward, put a drop of glue over words, or tape, and match up the two pieces (Figure 3); 6. For head, fold at dotted lines downward, put a drop of glue, or use tape, on each number, one number at a time, and create a 6-sided cube (Figure 4); 7. For crown, fold both dotted lines near windows of crown downward, fold the spikes up at dotted lines, put a drop of glue at words for crown, and add crown to head (Figure 5); 8. Glue head to body.

AS YOU CREATE: Think about what liberty, the concept, and Liberty, the statue, is made of.

Read *The Voice of Liberty*, written by Angelica Shirley Carpenter and illustrated by Edwin Fotheringham, to learn about three women who raised their voice for women across the United States by protesting at the Statue of Liberty.

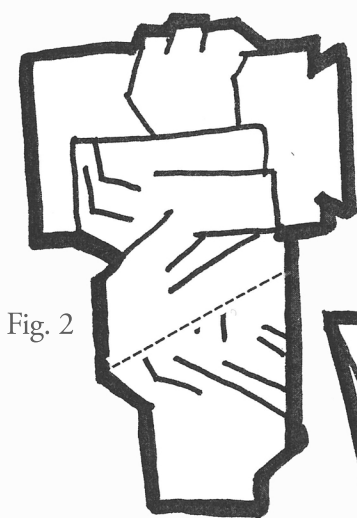

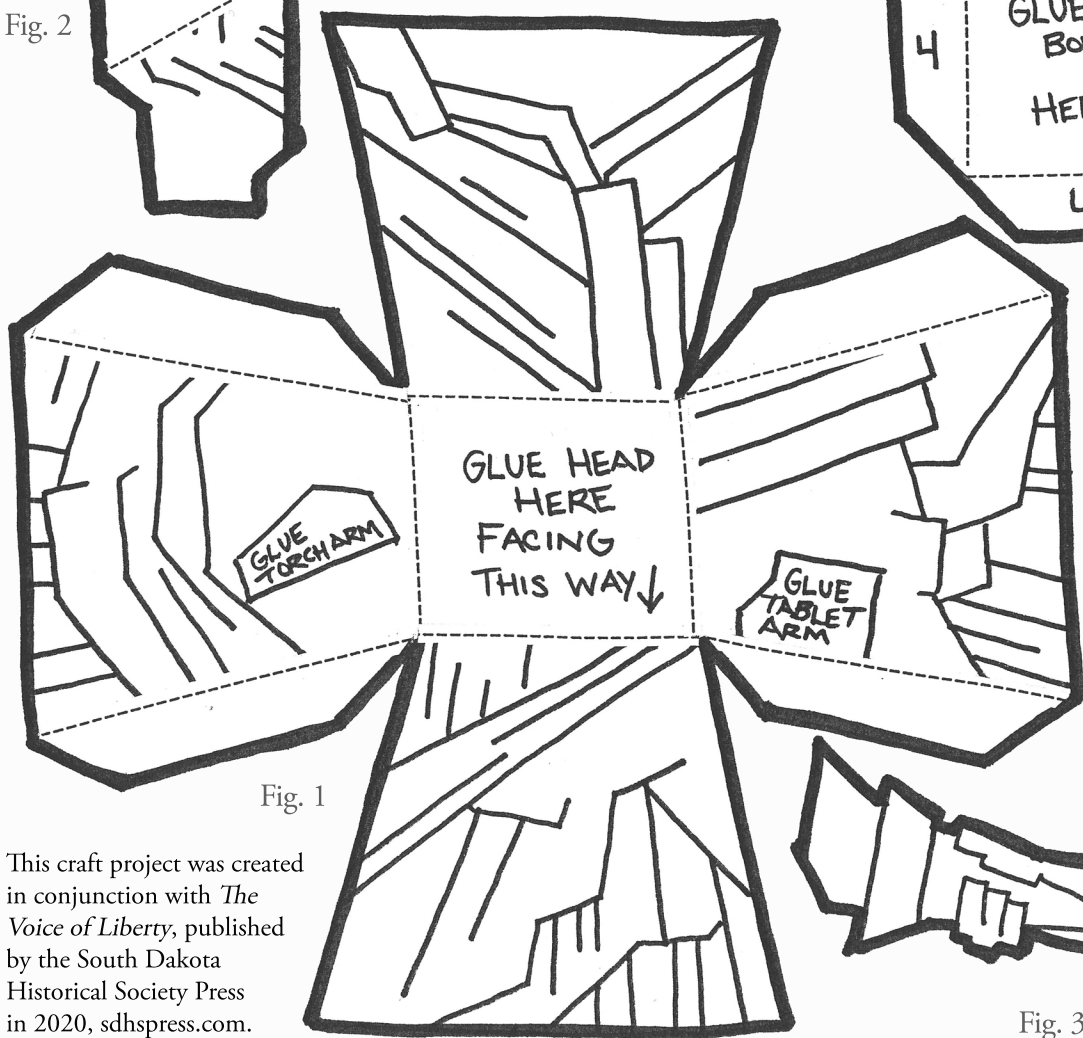

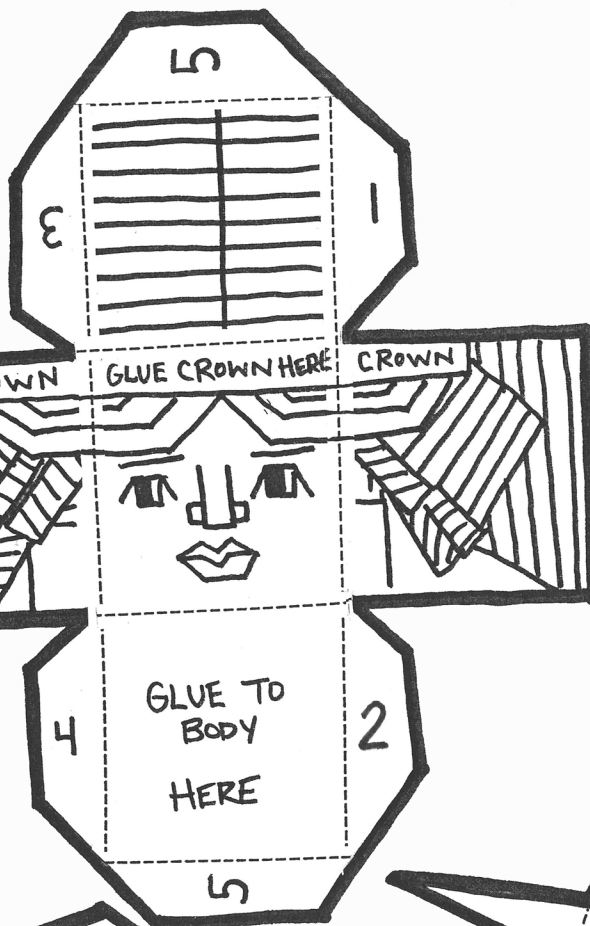

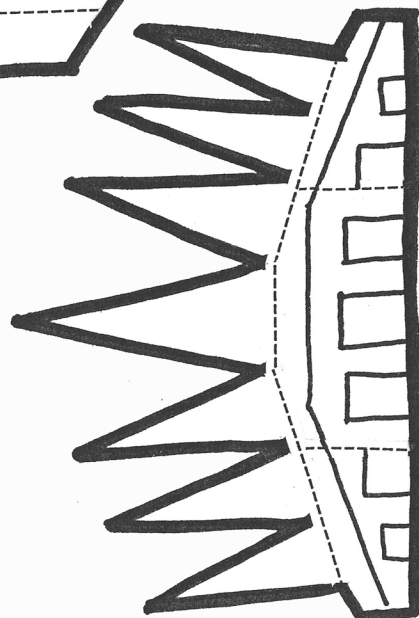

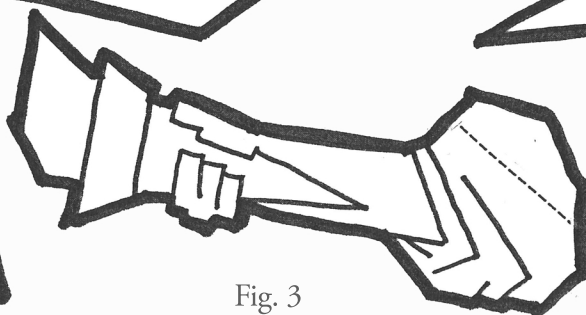
